Link to History unit – History of Westcliff. Firstly establish the knowledge some children will already have – Westcliff is in Scunthorpe – this is a Town. (Refer to the history lesson – Scunthorpe historically was made up of 5 villages) Share maps – digimaps. Determine vocabulary definitions Town, Village, country, city, continent – Locate Westcliff – it is in UK, world map, zoom in UK and country - England, Recap London is the capital city of England. In North Lincolnshire – county. Nearest sea – East coast – North Sea. UK is in Europe. Show children UK on globe. Task – use maps and atlases Map 1 - Children to complete map work labelling UK, England – on World map. Use atlas to locate places. Map 2 - London, Scunthorpe/Westcliff. North Sea. On UK map. Use atlases/maps to support finding places. Record also Scunthorpe – Town UK is in Europe – above the equator.

Continuation of previous of lesson / separate lesson. Establish/recap Westcliff is an area in Scunthorpe. Scunthorpe is a town. Define vocabulary and meanings - Human features and Physical features – Physical features: Town Hill Climate/weather House Office Shop Farm (covered in history when comparing old maps/new maps – Burringham Hill used to be a farm) land, urban, rivers – nearby River Trent. Weather /climate – what kind of weather – link to seasons and England is above the equator. Population – 6200 in total- number per sq foot. Vegetation in North Lincs, barley, wheat, oilseed rape and sugar beet. And green spaces. Human features: For the purpose of 'area' Westcliff, Scunthorpe – using the maps https://coronavirus.data.gov.uk/details/interactive-map/cases these maps give a clear line/boundaries https://www.ons.gov.uk/visualisations/customprofiles/draw/ site allows you to draw a polygon – using the coronavirus map as a guide for boundaries – gave a population of 6200 for 'Westcliff'
